City of Racine Shares Important Winter Updates for City Residents and Businesses

RACINE – Mayor Cory Mason, the Department of Public Works, and the Racine Police Department are reminding Racine residents and businesses about important winter regulations in advance of upcoming snow and colder weather.

The City's Winter Parking Regulations will go into effect on Sunday, December 1. Alternate side parking regulations are in effect seven days a week from December 1 to April 1 *except* December 25 and January 1. Between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. vehicles must park on the even-numbered side of the street on even-numbered calendar dates, and on the odd-numbered side of the street on odd-numbered calendar dates. Vehicles in violation of these restrictions are subject to ticketing and a \$20 fine.

During a declared snow emergency, there is no parking on arterial and collector streets. Violators will be towed. On local streets, alternate side parking regulations, based on the following day's date, remain in effect until 2 p.m.

City residents and business owners are also reminded that all City of Racine property owners are required by City Ordinance 82-109 to remove snow and ice from the full width of their sidewalks abutting their property within 24 hours after snow stops.

Failure to remove snow and ice from sidewalks in front, alongside, or adjacent to your property will result in a violation notice and \$50 inspection fee being mailed. Upon reinspection if still in violation, the property owner will receive an additional \$50 fee and be charged removal costs incurred by the Department of Public Works.
