THE BELOW NAMED COMPLAINANT BEING DULY SWORN, ON INFORMATION AND BELIEF STATES THAT:

Count 1: HARBORING OR AIDING A FELON

The above-named defendant on or about Wednesday, December 25, 2024, at 6901 W. Vienna Ave., in the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, with intent to prevent the apprehension of a felon, did aid that person, and the offense committed by the felon being aided is a Class B felony, contrary to sec. 946.47(1)(a) and (2m)(a), 939.50(3)(g) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Class G Felony, the defendant may be fined not more than Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), or imprisoned not more than ten (10) years, or both.

Probable Cause:

I am a City of Milwaukee law enforcement officer and base this complaint on my own investigation and on the reports of fellow officers.

On December 25, 2024, at about noon, police were sent to the area near 3701 W. Scott St., Milwaukee, for a shooting. Upon arrival they found a white Kia that had crashed into a parked car. Inside the Kia were two gunshot victims. The male victim, ER, was suffering from gunshot wounds to the head and chest and was pronounced deceased on scene. The female victim, NV, was suffering from gunshot wounds to the head and leg; she was transported to a hospital and died shortly after her arrival there.

Police recovered video from cameras that show the shooting. It shows the white Kia arrive at the area of the shooting and pull over to the side of the street and stop; no one exits the car, making it appear that car is waiting for someone. After a few minutes a black Chevy Malibu crosses the intersection where the Kia is parked, and a man is hanging out of the front passenger window, firing a gun at the Kia as the Malibu drives past it. The Kia then rolls forwards and hits a parked car. Detectives who viewed the video were able to take note of distinctive markings to the black Malibu.

Later that same day, a black Malibu was discovered burnt in Dineen Park, 6901 W. Vienna Ave., Milwaukee. Cameras near the burn location showed that the black Malibu arrived at the park followed by a black Jeep. The Malibu and its distinctive features matched the Malibu from the shooting on the south side. The black Jeep leaves the park shortly after smoke appears from the where the Malibu was found burnt.

Detectives determined that owner of the Malibu was a woman, Witness 1. Detectives Cedric McFadden and Curtis Pelczynski interviewed Witness 1, who said that the burnt Malibu is titled to her, but she had

been in the process of selling it to the defendant, who had been driving it. She said that after police informed her that the car had been found burned, she went and spoke to the defendant, who was at a house along with two other men. She said that one of these men (not the defendant) admitted to her that he had shot at the white Kia on the south side. The defendant admitted to her that he had been in the Malibu, driving it, at the time of that shooting.

Detectives James Jordan and Alexander Klabunde spoke to another witness, Witness 2. Witness 2 said that he was the rear passenger of the Malibu at the time of the shooting on the south side. He said that the defendant was driving the Malibu at the time of the shooting. He said that after the shooting, he (Witness 2) drove the Malibu to the burn site at Dineen Park. He said that the defendant followed in a charcoal Jeep, waited in the Jeep while Witness 2 and the shooter set the Malibu ablaze, then drove the three of them away from the park. He identified the defendant from a booking photo, explaining that he has known the defendant for a long time.
